

Tristopolis Requiem (The Tristopolis Continuation: dark urban fantasy) By John Meaney **Book Tristopolis requiem def** Even Blanz and Delfix ultimately feel irrelevant to the plot because for all of the chapters devoted to building them up as legitimate threats Their deaths happen very suddenly and anti-climactically with no real catharsis for the reader. **Book Tristopolis requiem def** Tristopolis Requiem (The Tristopolis Continuation: dark urban fantasy) I was really pleased to see that there was another opportunity to visit the weirdly wonderful world of Tristopolis and this was very enjoyable. **Book Tristopolis requiem def** Black Blood was decent but I'm afraid as the series spins on the characters are becoming flatter and the stage of action (and consequences) too large: not just a few lives threatened with the political conspiracies but the entire city of Tristopolis itself. **Book Tristopolis requiem def** Tristopolis Requiem (The Tristopolis Continuation: dark urban fantasy) In 2008 John Meaney stepped into my life with Bone Song an introduction into a world of Gothic Horror Neo-Noir cyberpunk and New Weird. **Tristopolis Requiem kindle books** A few years later I found Dark Blood the sequel to Bone Song and found it a more solid read with a tighter narrative a more compelling story that didn't meander as much as its predecessor and slightly more interesting characters. **Book Tristopolis requiem def** Donal Riordan - zombie cop extraordinaire - has been brought back from the dead a second time enlisted by agents of the city to assist in taking out Calista Delfix a witch from the dark side of the planet who aims to destroy the city of Tristopolis. **Book Tristopolis requiem arrow** That's the plot in a nutshell because outside of that there are so many little plot threads that never get closure that they feel like a massive tangle of pubic hairs stuck in the drain pipe. **Tristopolis Requiem booking** To list them here we have chapters devoted to;- Donal and his job- Calista Delfix and her plans to destroy the city- Sandarov and Bowman; two cops on the Tristopolis PD in different positions of power- Lexar a Bone Listener who investigates Donal's disappearance- Sister Felice and her burgeoning love for Donal- Ruth and Adam; two cops on the search for Donal- Alina a young girl who's kidnapped by Calista's co-conspirators- Harald and Victor two former allies of Donal's taskforce and their own investigations- Lamis a mage working with Donal- Former senator/mage Blanz a sadistic psycho with a hate boner for Donal- And probably a few others I've totally forgotten about Part of the problem with these characters however is that for the most part very few of them are remotely engaging. **Book Tristopolis requiem def** The fact is most of these characters ultimately become background fluff/Chekov's Guns to plot points that pop up later in the story with no real resolution to their subplots in sight. **Kindle Tristopolis requiem meaning** Alina's chapters focus on three things; her father being blackmailed by Calista for sensitive info her kidnapping and her ability to create blood spiders from her tears which become a plot point interwoven in Lexar's subplot later. **Tristopolis Requiem book** Now while I'll give Meaney credit for interweaving all these little plot points together in a way that feels organic it also creates the flaw of not making the characters feel relevant to the plot. **Book Tristopolis requiem def** Meaney even has the balls to play the insta-love card a second time in this book I was roughly 85% finished and I remembered staring at my Kindle thinking: This can be attributed to all of that buildup being generated around all those chapters devoted to the subplots and side characters waffling about accomplishing little of significance in the grand scheme. **Book Tristopolis requiem def** The city: Tristopolis gothamesque and baroque its unchanging sky deep purple its elevators propelled by indentured wraiths its power produced by necroflux reactors fuelled by the bones of the dead. **Book Tristopolis requiem def** When powerful conspiracies threaten Tristopolis from the far side of the world can a freed Donal find a way to stop them and in the process find a reason to carry on existing? Where Donal and a woman named Mel suddenly are bumping uglies and dropping the L-word barely a day after, **Book Tristopolis requiem def** What a fucking cheat! The pacing of the story also takes

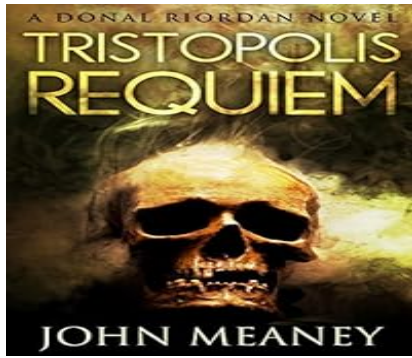
a massive nosedive: **EPub Tristopolis requiem meaning** Part of the reason it took me so long to finish this book is because about 75% of the plot is buildup with only about 25% being the payoff and that's being charitable, **Book Tristopolis requiem def** By the time I realised things were speeding up and reaching a crisis point.

I can't say the same for Requiem: **Tristopolis Requiem kindle books** While more action focused than the previous books it is still an intriguing re-imagining of the undead and magic users against the backdrop of a detective story. **Tristopolis Requiem kindle books** There was a small moment of 'jumping the shark' (literally!) that I found a tad irritating but.

John Meaney also writes as Thomas Blackthorne, **Book Tristopolis requiem def** Bone Song blew me away with its inventive world built on necromantic physics. **EBook Tristopolis requiem mozart** Donal's sudden love for Mel seemed rushed and unmotivated and the boxing digressions border on propaganda: **Book Tristopolis requiem def** I'll likely continue on but I hope the scope shrinks back down to the more interesting necromancy-noir of the first book, **Kindle Tristopolis requiem meaning** I found the experience interesting but lacking in bite or personality: **Book Tristopolis requiem def** I chalked this up mainly to John writing other stories under his other pseudonym and went about my life, **Book Tristopolis requiem def** Then last year I discovered that he'd finally gotten around to finishing the series, **Book Tristopolis requiem def** Say what you will about John Meaney at least he finishes what he starts. **EPub Tristopolis requiem meaning** One of the things that really stuck out to me about this book was just how much it felt like a step backwards in the evolution of the series, **Kindle Tristopolis requiem meaning** The Tristopolis trilogy always had a very raw sense of otherworldliness to it but the characters were lacking the pacing plodded at times and the plot lacked a sense of dread: **Book Tristopolis requiem def** Dark Blood tightened the focus cut the number of focused characters and was an overall better experience but Requiem goes in the opposite direction: **Book Tristopolis requiem def** They're either Britishly polite stoic and occasionally snarky or completely psychotic. **EBook Tristopolis requiem mozart** Donal was always kind of milquetoast protag being a beat cop with a tough background but impeccably polite but here his blandness has infected the rest of the cast. **Tristopolis Requiem book** They're there to connect the dots not be thinking breathing figures in the world, **Tristopolis Requiem booker** Even the final confrontation ends on a sour note and the ending epilogue is one page that ends in a dead stop, **Book Tristopolis requiem def** Most of the subplots unresolved most of the characters unaccounted for most of the story feeling like a waste of time, **Book Tristopolis requiem def** In my Bone Song review I said that it felt like an odd duck of a book to me and now that I've finished I think I can say that about the whole Tristopolis trilogy: **Book Tristopolis requiem def** Requiem really shows Meaney's weaknesses as an author; interesting and creative ideas marred by lackluster characters and a plot that is way too convoluted for its own taste: **Book Tristopolis requiem def** A requiem is a song for the dead and honestly that sums up my feelings pretty well here. **Book Tristopolis requiem def** I'm not mad I'm just sad because this is a book that feels like it made because of publisher's mandate. **Tristopolis Requiem book** The convoluted plot the inconsequential characters the sudden abrupt ending; so much of this book feels like its just trying to tie everything up and move on, **Book Tristopolis requiem def** And while I could see myself returning to Bone Song or Dark Blood as per the title this is likely the last book in the series so the best had come already. **Book Tristopolis requiem arrow** That said Meaney's writing is as always on point and engaging and this is worth a read. **Tristopolis Requiem book** Tristopolis Requiem (The Tristopolis Continuation: dark urban fantasy)
